IN THE GARDEN By Lisa Joseph, Community Horticulturist

When soaring temperatures and oppressive humidity this month make gardening chores almost unbearable, try to get out there early in the day to water as needed and to keep up on the never-ending weeding.

Your annuals should be really taking off now. Be sure to keep up the fertilizing and watering. Cut a bouquet for a vase indoors. Having flowers in the house will do wonders for your well-being.

I DECLARE WAR ON THIS PUSHY WEED:

Yellow Wood Sorrel- Oxalis

Yellow Wood Sorrel has foliage that is similar to that of Clover, except that its three heart-shaped leaflets have a crease up the center, and the small 5-petaled flowers are bright yellow. It will grow in both sun and shade with a tough root system that branches out in the soil. If you leave any of the root behind in the soil while attempting to dig it out, the weed will grow right



back. If you are hand weeding, take care to dig out the entire tenacious root system. The prolific seed capsules explode when touched, spewing seeds in your face and all over the place. Some of the seedpods carry up to 5,000 seeds, so you can understand why it is important to control this weed before it sets seed!

A smaller version of Clematis for limited garden space? THE BOULEVARD SERIES CLEMATIS

Mature size is just 5' in height by 4' in width; profusion of blooms all along the vines in spring and again in summer. You can either train these shorter Clematis vines to climb a trellis or support or just let them politely ramble through the garden.



BOULEVARD OLYMPIA CLEMATIS- deep violet blooms.

BOULEVARD CHEROKEE- rosy pink blooms with a darker pink bar.

BOULEVARD DAIYU- deep cherry pink blooms.

BOULEVARD PARISIENNE- deep lavender blue blooms.

CLEMATIS CARE: The extensive root system of Clematis

requires regular deep watering during the first growing season in order to become well established. MULCH to conserve moisture. Clematis like to have their root zones sheltered and their faces in the sun. Apply a general purpose slow-release fertilizer as new growth appears in the spring.

COMBINE WITH: Hardy Geranium around the legs of the Clematis to shade the root zone; 'Bright Eyes' Garden Phlox, Siberian Iris, 'Dark Towers' Penstemon, Dianthus 'Shooting Star' or 'Firewitch', and Caryopteris 'Sunshine Blue' (Bluebeard).

REMEMBER THE LATE SUMMER BLOOMERS.... You will be grateful in the fall when your garden still looks fabulous!

ASTER 'KICKIN CARMINE RED' - Mature size 3 x 3'



This perennial has a bushy, compact habit that doesn't require mid-season pruning or staking. In late summer, it is completely covered with bright magentared blooms with gold centers. Aster is native to North America and is attractive to butterflies and other pollinators.

Plant Aster 'Kickin Carmine Red' in full sun (6 hours of sun per day) and allow for good air circulation to avoid powdery mildew.

COMBINE WITH: Other fall bloomers such as

Sedum, Ornamental Grasses, Joe-Pye Weed, Dahlia, and with the fall foliage colors of Amsonia (Bluestar), Chokeberry, Summersweet, Viburnum, and Fothergilla. Try planting short Zinnias in front of 'Kickin Carmine Red' Aster that will give you color all summer then continue to bloom in sync with the Aster.
