Compost carts

The city offers single-family residential properties one free 64- or 96-gallon compost cart. Pick up is free or one can be delivered to you for a fee, additional carts are also available for a fee. To order a cart and arrange for pick up or delivery, please contact the customer service center at 734.994.7336 or via customerservice@a2gov.org.

Carts exceeding 112 pounds for the 32-gallon, 224 pounds for the 64-gallon, or 336 pounds for the 96-gallon size will not be serviced.

Acceptable compost materials


- Plate scrapings and food waste (including meat & bones)*
- Bamboo dinnerware*
- Grass clippings*
- BPI certified compostable bags, containers, silverware, etc.
- Leaves and brush
- Branches less than 6 inches diameter (must fit w/lid closed)
- Unpainted, untreated lumber (must fit in cart with lid closed)
- Weeds
- Undecorated and cut up Christmas trees
- Garden pruning, garden surplus, crab apples, etc.
- Used, cool wood ashes make great garden & flower bed fertilizer. I f you aren't able to use them there, then please place in compost cart.

*Items for optional compost carts only.

Unacceptable compost materials

- Plastic bags or containers
- Trash and recyclables
- Dirt, rocks, stones or gravel
- Sawdust
- Branches over 6 inches in diameter or over 4 feet in length
- Painted or treated wood
- Animal waste or cat litter
- Tree stumps
- Diapers

Right to Inspect upon sale for Building Permit / Modification Issues

Thinking of doing work in your Condo without building permits? Don't. Just don't.

Stories abound—from the amusing to the legendary—about homeowners who decide to do their own plumbing or wiring or to tear out walls here and there without bothering to get a building permit. In a standalone, single-family house, that is certainly an interesting decision, and one that usually affects only the owner of that house when things get...interesting.

HOWEVER, in attached housing that dangerous wiring, explosive plumbing, and collapsing roof (yes, some walls are actually necessary to hold up the roof) can at the least really ruin the day/month/year of your neighbor and at the most endanger their lives. This is not a small matter, and our Association has a responsibility to do its best to make sure these dangers are limited or eliminated, and when it becomes aware of non-permitted work to get it corrected.

Picture the new co-owner who learns at some point that the reason they are having trouble getting their front door open is because that wonderful open kitchen/dining/living room layout they fell in love with was done without a permit and included the removal of a load-bearing wall without installing a new support beam to replace the function of that wall. THEIR problem, you say? Well, actually it could be YOUR problem, too, if the co-owner makes the case that the Association should have known or actually knew about the issue and took no steps to make the previous owner fix it.

One excellent opportunity for the Association to identify these problems is at the time of sale. That way, the seller can be held responsible for making needed repairs. Currently, the Association does not have a resale inspection policy; however, the Board has started discussions.

Oh...yeah...and if a building permit is required for your project you also need approval from the Maintenance and Modification Committee. They are a lovely group of people who do their best to be helpful by sharing institutional knowledge and standard specifications for common projects to guide you and your contractor.

Honestly, watering is a no brainer, right? When its dry, you water, but did you know when and how you water is important and overall

better for not only the environment but your pocketbook?

Watering all plants is most efficient before the sun completely comes up and/or right before night. This allows the plant time to "recoup" and not overtop watering cuts back on mildews. Also, less evaporation occurs during these time periods. Just remember, don't over-water. So go water all new plantings plus all of those gorgeous annuals I have been seeing around the property.
