Gentle Reminder to folks:

Resident Rules 2.8 Signs

a. Display of signs:

As a general rule, political, promotional, and rental signs may be displayed only from windows of residential units.

For local, state, or federal elections, however, residents may display election-related signs in limited common areas in the two (2) weeks prior to the election; signs must be removed within 24 hours after the date of the election.
